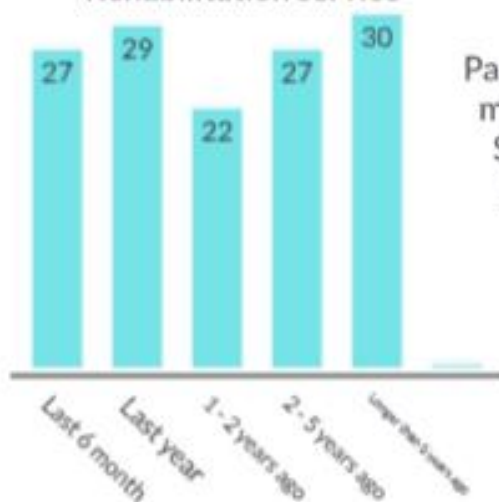


When respondents or their family member had used the Stroke Rehabilitation service

## Comments regarding barriers of preferred option

*People have problems with travelling and the costs incurred to get to Durham*

*Bigger is not always better, sometimes having care split could mean better care however*

*Specialisation is not always helpful and there still should be services available for people outside of Durham as much as possible.*

*Durham hospital short of beds now, where will they put extra patients.*

*The current level of service at BAGH ie excellent, travel and parking for visitors is good, I haven't seen anything that suggests UHND has the space or relaxed environment to deliver a similar service.*

Percentage of respondents who were female



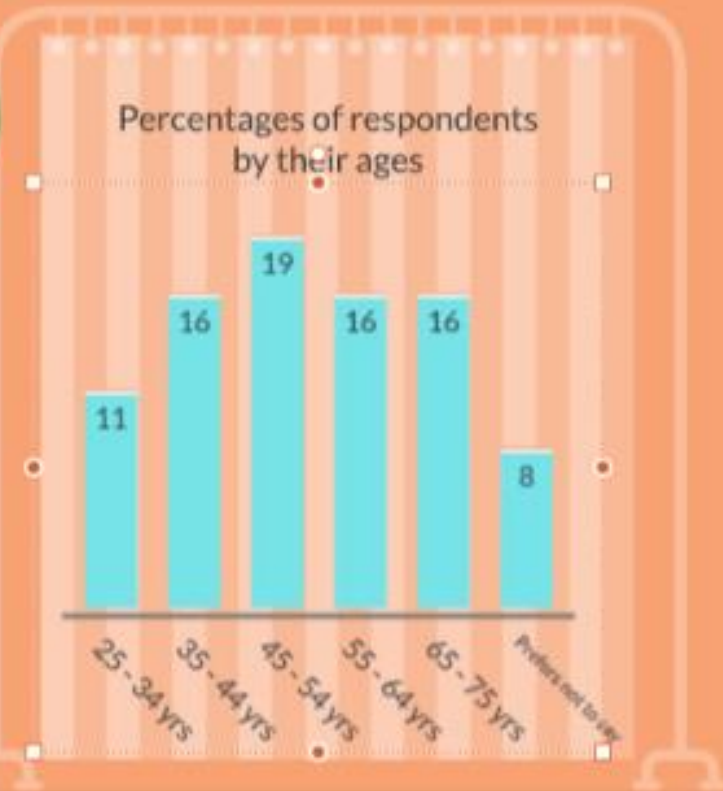
Percentage of respondents who identify as having a Disability or Long Term Illness



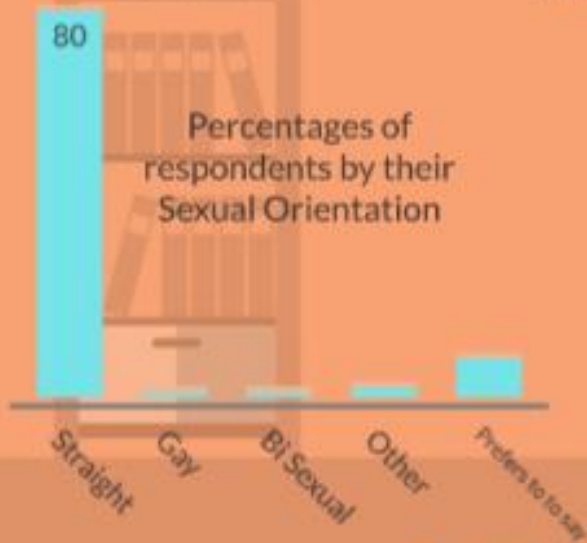
Percentage of respondents who identify as 'White English'
