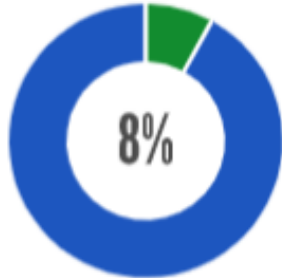


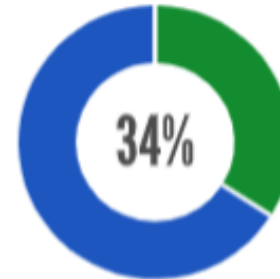
Having the staff to provide care so they can get patients better as quickly as possible

Reduction in beds could be an issue when there is demand.

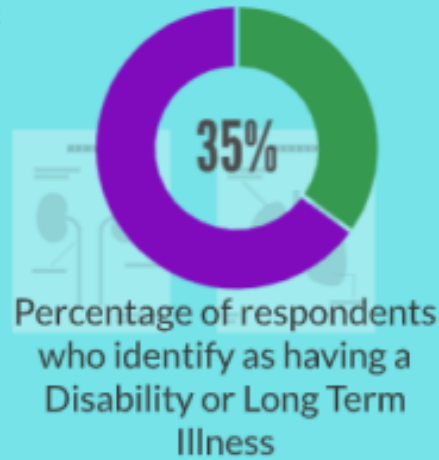
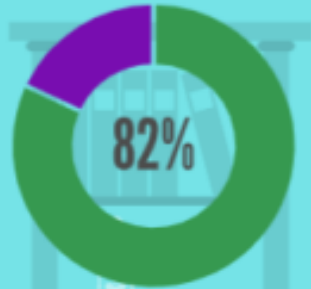
It is a shame to lose beds, I personally feel that you could stay on ward 6 and increase the budget to include therapies.

Cutting the number of beds puts more pressure on staff and resources at these other two major hospitals that are struggling to cope.

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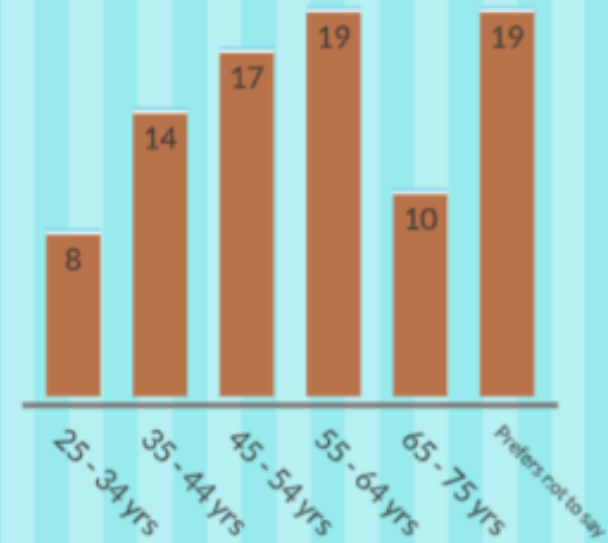
Percentage of respondents who were female



Percentage of respondents who identify as 'White English'



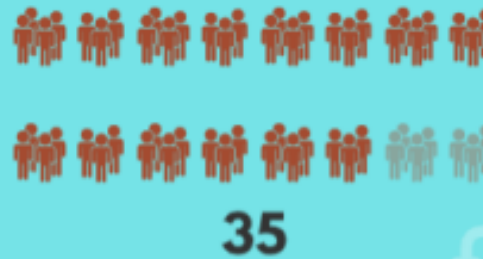
Percentages of respondents by their ages
